KINDERGARTEN (K5)

Bible

God's Story and Our Faith: The kindergarten bible curriculum introduces children to key stories and themes from the Old and New Testaments, teaching God's love, faithfulness, and plan for His people. Through engaging lessons, children explore creation, the lives of biblical figures like Noah, Abraham, Moses, David, Esther, and Jesus, and learn about obedience, kindness, courage, forgiveness, and trust in God. Activities include storytelling, prayer, and practical applications to help children understand their relationship with God, follow Jesus' teachings, and develop a heart for serving others.

Reading

Reading of sentences and stories from twelve books containing one- and two-vowel words and special sounds

Language

Recognition of sentences by capital letters and periods, rhyming words, opposites Textbook: ABEKA

Phonics/Spelling

Recognition of name, sound, and picture of long and short vowels and consonants, sounding of blends, one and two-vowel words, and words with special sounds, beginning phonics rules and special sounds

Students will also learn the first 100 sight words from the Frye Sight word list Textbook: ABEKA

Students are required to memorize the first 100 sight words from the Frye word list.

Math

The focus of mathematics in kindergarten is the use of manipulatives with an interactive approach to build a strong foundation of number sense. Students will also be introduced to addition, subtraction, measurement, time and calendar, and shapes. Students are also to achieve automaticity of basic addition facts.

Science

This nature-based science curriculum integrates hands-on exploration, folk songs, poetry, picture study, and living books to inspire children to connect with the natural world. Weekly themes engage students through activities like nature walks, sensory play, simple experiments, and creative projects. Young learners develop observation, narration, and motor skills through nature note booking, rhymes, and art activities tailored for their abilities. This curriculum fosters curiosity, creativity, and a love for learning in an engaging, multi-sensory approach to science.
