Continue reading even when school is out for the summer!. Reading promotes fluency, increases children's vocabulary, stimulates their imagination, expands their knowledge of the world, and increases/maintains their comprehension skills. To prevent the typical "summer slide" students experience when not in school, we are requiring students to read. Each grade level has developed a specific reading assignment (see your grade level below). These are also some resources and many offer prizes.

Entering 1st Grade

Students must also draw, color, and label a picture of their favorite part of the book, and write a sentence describing their picture. This is required reading and the assignment will need to be turned in on the first day of the new school year as their first summative test grade.
